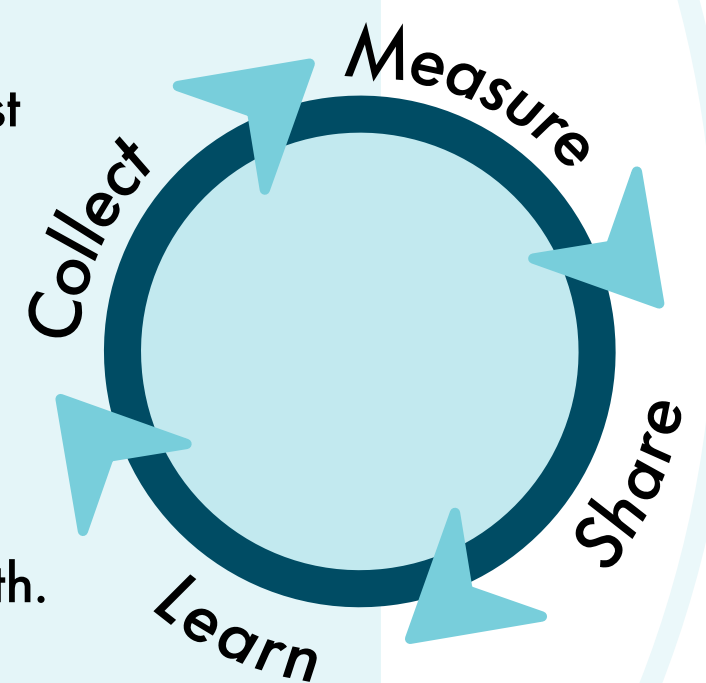
A perfect fit for watershed stewardship groups, and a great activity for all...

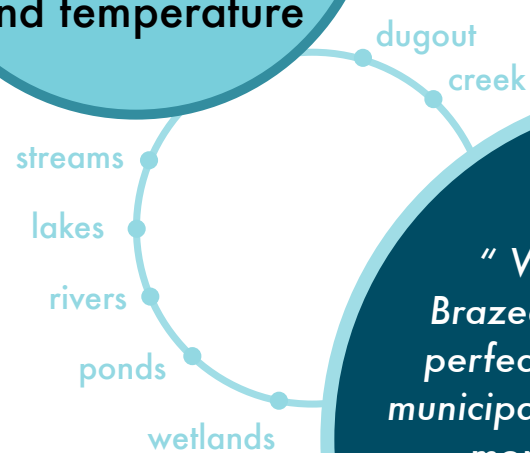
It's easy and fun to take part!

- 1 **Register** your class for the program and for your free water quality test kit at www.awqa.ca by April 30th
- 2 **Choose** any stream, river, lake, wetland, pond, reservoir, dugout, or other waterbody in Alberta.
- 3 **Collect** and test water using your kit anytime between May 1st and August 31st.
- 4 **Post** your results at www.awqa.ca to share with others by September 15th.

Test for four basic measures of water quality: pH, turbidity, dissolved oxygen and temperature
